

Benefits

Vacation / Sick / Holiday Pay: Officers with less than 5 years of service with the university earn 12 sick days and 13.75 vacation days a year. In addition, the university observes 11 paid holidays per year. Officers required to work holidays will receive Holiday Premium Pay.

Education: Officers may take three courses free of charge per academic year.

Facilities: Use of Library, gymnasium, pool, basketball courts and tennis courts are free to employees.

Health Insurance: The State Comprehensive Health Plan is free for members.

Retirement: Officers participate in the NC TSERS (Teacher and State Employee Retirement System) and are eligible for full retirement after 30 years of service.

Other Benefits: Dental, Vision, Life Insurance and Flexible Spending Accounts are available to university employees.

Introduction to The UNCC Police Department

The UNC Charlotte Police Department serves the University community year round with full police powers. The department strives to uphold the highest ideals of law-enforcement while engaging students, faculty and staff in partnerships to make the University a safe place in which to learn, live and work.

Who We Are:

The UNC Charlotte Police Department has approximately 50 sworn law enforcement positions, and additional civilian support staff. The department employs four patrol squads, and specialized units such as investigations and SWAT. The UNCC Police and Public Safety Department embraces community-policing, which emphasizes crime prevention and detection through interaction with the University community.

Patrol Division

Members of the Patrol Division serve the University 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Patrol squads work twelve hour shifts which begin at 6:00 am or 6:00 pm. Officers work permanent shifts, with each squad working approximately 14 days per month. Additional overtime work is required for training, court appearances, campus events, athletic events and shift coverage. All patrol officers are given uniforms, boots, equipment and training free of charge. Each patrol officer is responsible for patrolling an assigned area of the University through foot, vehicle and bike patrols. Officers also patrol the housing areas surrounding the University as per a mutual aid agreement with the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department.



Community Oriented Policing

Community Oriented Policing (COP) is the cornerstone philosophy of the UNCC Police Department. Each police officer is dedicated to community policing and ensuring the safety of the University community. The COP mission of the department is led by a full time COP coordinator, and officers support this mission through regular participation in events designed to strengthen communication and cooperation between the UNCC Police Department and the community.
